The September Ember Days are a quarterly period of prayer, fasting, and partial or complete abstinence observed on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday following the Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14th). Rooted in ancient agricultural traditions and sanctified by the early Church, these autumn days were traditionally used to thank God for the autumn harvest, pray for the upcoming transition of seasons, and spiritually prepare new priests through special prayers for sacred ordinations.

GOSPEL Matt. 22:34-46
At that time, the Pharisees, hearing that he had silenced the Sadducees, came together. And one of them, a doctor of the law, asked him, tempting him: "Master, which is the great commandment in the law?"
Jesus said to him: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart

and with thy whole soul and with thy whole mind.' This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like to this: 'Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.' On these two commandments dependeth the whole law and the prophets."
